

**“2<sup>nd</sup> International Youth Meeting: European Citizen – Where are you?”**  
**23<sup>rd</sup> of May – 31<sup>st</sup> of May 2011**  
**Belgrade, SERBIA**



**Dear colleagues, partners and friends,**

**Hereby we are presenting you the first as well as some **NEW** information on our common “2<sup>nd</sup> International Youth Meeting: European Citizen – Where are you?”. Please read it carefully and provide interested participants from your organisation with all given and requested information.**

From 1<sup>st</sup> - 7<sup>th</sup> of August 2010 took place in Heilbad Heiligenstadt, close to the Thuringian capital Erfurt, GERMANY the “1st International Youth Meeting: European Citizen – Where are you?” with more than 40 participants from programme countries of the EU in the frame of the YOUTH IN ACTION programme of the European Commission. We gathered young people and people active in youth work from different European countries in order to offer them a platform to discuss basic issues concerning participation and European citizenship, share experiences and additionally learn more about specific non-formal methods they may use in youth projects later on.

For this purpose, we organised many different activities on several floors. Hence, participants had the opportunity to choose within the programme. Every working day equaled one cluster with a corresponding roof topic, ranging from democracy to media. The clusters, however, were always connected to the framework of the meeting – participation of the youth, European citizenship and non-formal learning. In order to support discussions and deliver some valuable input, experts from fields such as politics, social work and media were invited to join the meeting every now and then. They not only gave examples related to real life, they also helped to do what the project intended: offering alternative points of view.

**With the “2<sup>nd</sup> International Youth Meeting: European Citizen – Where are you?” we are going to establish a mire stable fundament of active citizenship, participation and non-formal learning. We will bring together project workers, youth leaders, facilitators and other interested youngsters from more than 20 different European countries, from programme countries of the EU and neighbouring partner countries from SEE, based on the experiences made in summer 2010 in Germany.**

In this spirit, the main aim of the youth meeting is, generally, to support the idea of an active European citizen. We have created a colourful programme, taking place on several floors, which includes a wide-ranging supply of thematic points. Those points are developed and selected in such a manner that they are covering different conditions and connected topics concerning an active European citizenship. However, the theoretical inputs and the discussions supported by political decision-makers and experts in youth work should not only encourage the participants to think about the corresponding topics, the supreme aim is always to derive improvements for the praxis of realising participation projects in the sense of the YOUTH IN ACTION programme of the European Commission.

## Travel costs

We will reimburse **70% of the travel costs** for the YM on the basis of the **cheapest possibilities**, e.g. second class railway tickets, APEX-flights etc. by bank transfer after the YM and the receipt of **complete and original tickets, bills, receipts, boarding cards** etc. Arrival day is 23<sup>rd</sup> of May 2011 (later arrivals are not possible). Official departure day is the 31<sup>st</sup> of May 2011 (earlier departure times are not possible).

### ***Please note!***

1. We are not allowed to reimburse the costs for travelling by car! Any costs for taxi are not eligible (exceptions possible after consultancy)!
2. In case single persons arriving later than 23<sup>rd</sup> of May 2011 or leaving before 31<sup>st</sup> of May 2011 any related costs (e.g. for booked hotel room) will be reduced from the travel cost reimbursement.
3. Following the guide lines of the YiA programme the travel must be realised by the participants on direct way within maximum 2 days. In case of longer stays or indirect travelling (holiday travel

### By plane to Belgrade:

If you come by plane you arrive in the airport "Nikola Tesla" <http://www.beg.aero/welcome.54.html>. Since in Belgrade the passenger transport by the airport (shuttle) is cancelled until further notice you have to use the public bus "PTC "Belgrade" Line 72". The route is described here <http://www.gsp.rs/english/additional.asp?id=72>. The bus goes from 05:15 until 00:00 hours every ~30 minutes and starts in front of the upper building of the airport (departure section of the airport). The ticket price is 80 RSD (approx. 0,75 EUR) if bought on newsstand, 120 RSD (approx. 1,15 EUR) if bought in the bus. You leave the bus at the final station named "ZELENI VENAC". The approximate travel time is 30 - 40 minutes. 
The easiest way to reach "Hotel N" from the station "ZELENI VENAC" is to walk to the main bus/train station and take the tram 9 in the direction of Banjica (Бањица). You take the tram until the street Vojvode Stepe (Војводе степе) and get off at the Electrotechnical College (Visoke škole elektrotehnike). From there follow the map below.

There is also the possibility to use a taxi to get from the airport to the hotel (about 1000 RSD, means approx. 10 EUR). If you choose this option, remind that the Executive Agency is not refunding costs for taxi. So you have to pay it on your own, it will not be refunded!!

### By train/bus to Belgrade:

If you come by train or bus to Belgrade you should arrive in the main train/main bus station. To get to "Hotel N" from the main train station and the main bus station take the tram number 9 in the direction of Banjica (Бањица). You take the tram until the street Vojvode Stepe (Војводе степе) and get off at the Electrotechnical College (Visoke škole elektrotehnike). From there follow the map below.
